How to fundraise?



Before your school starts fundraising for Grow Hope, we want to hear from you! Let us know which of our programs you're interested in supporting and if there's anything we can do to assist.

There are many ways to go about holding a fundraiser and these are just some ideas we have collected from teachers, support staff and students who have organised fundraising activities for Grow Hope at their schools.

Step 1: assemble a team

Many hands make light work, so start by drawing together a group of students and staff who have the skills and passion to spearhead your school's fundraising efforts. Organising fundraising events is a great way to develop student leadership and, particularly in a secondary school, students will be more likely to support an activity if it is driven and championed by their peers.

Your school may already have a student representative council, a captain for community service, a social justice group or similar. If so, you've already covered the first step!

Step 2: decide on a fundraising method

There are many tried and true methods that schools use to raise money for causes. These include:

- A sausage sizzle
- A casual clothes day with a gold coin donation
- A fundraising appeal during National Reconciliation Week
- A cake stall
- A lunchtime walkathon

All of these methods are simple and fun, yet impactful. Together with your team, decide what works best for your school.



Step 3: promotion is essential

Use posters, emails, parent notices, speeches at assembly and any other means of promotion at your disposal to ensure that everyone knows when your fundraiser is, why your school is holding it, and where the money will be going.
